CURRENT ROLE

Since June 2020, I have served as Purdue University Fort Wayne's COVID-19 Point of Contact, Director of Strategic Planning and Implementation, and Director of the Office of Academic Innovation, while also teaching one course each semester in the Department of History, where I have an academic appointment as an associate professor.

ADMINISTRATIVE APPOINTMENTS AND LEADERSHIP POSITIONS

University COVID-19 Point of Contact, Purdue University Fort Wayne, June 2020 – present

I provide oversight and coordination of all aspects of the university's response to COVID-19. In my role as Director of Strategic Planning and Implementation, I designed and managed an intensive month-long scenario planning process in May 2020 to prepare the university for a return to in-person instruction and work for the 2020-21 academic year. From June 2020 onward, I have coordinated the implementation of return-to-campus plans, internal and external communication related to COVID-19, health and safety protocols, and transition planning for post-COVID operations. Specific responsibilities include:

- Serving as the primary point of contact for students, staff, faculty, and community stakeholders who have questions, comments, or concerns about any aspect of the university's COVID-19 response, including leading weekly virtual Q&A Sessions to provide updates and answer questions
- Coordinating with executive leadership and university administrative offices to ensure timely and accurate communication with the university and consistent understanding and enforcement of COVID protocols
- Serving on the PFW Prepared, Emergency Operations, and Crisis Management Committees
- Designing and implementing: classroom contact tracing protocols in collaboration with the Indiana State Department of Health and the Allen County Department of Health, short-term COVID-19 testing programs in collaboration with Lutheran Health Physicians, and short-term COVID-19 vaccination clinics in collaboration with Indiana University Fort Wayne and Walmart Pharmacy
- Leading operations and academics planning committees focused on transitioning from COVID operations to a better normal that leverages recent learning and innovation to improve the university for students, staff, and faculty
- Acting as a university spokesperson to respond to media inquiries and interview requests

Director of the Office of Academic Innovation, Purdue University Fort Wayne, May 2019 – present

As founding Director of the Office of Academic Innovation, I support academic planning, program development, and partnerships to ensure that the university's academic offerings meet regional workforce and economic development needs. Specific responsibilities include:

- Long-term academic planning focused on using regional economic and workforce development data to inform investments in new faculty and academic programs
- Collaborating with higher education and industry partners to increase and improve opportunities for students and faculty
- Facilitating changes to academic department, school, and college structures
- With Purdue Fort Wayne's Chancellor, representing the university in executive meetings of the Northeast Indiana Regional Partnership's Northeast Indiana Colleges and Universities Network
- Serving as the inaugural chair of the Northeast Indiana Colleges and Universities Network
 - The Network is a collaborative effort of 10 unaffiliated institutions located in northeast Indiana, representing 2- and 4-year public and private institutions and more than 40,000 students
 - As chair, I am responsible for leading an effort to formalize the Network's activities, structure, and modes of collaboration

Representative achievements include:

- With the department of Biology, creation of a new Certificate in Agricultural Leadership in collaboration with the College of Agriculture at Purdue University that was developed after extensive market research and interviews with industry and economic development leaders across northeast Indiana and northwest Ohio
- Developed and implemented a process to transition the College of Arts and Sciences into the College of Liberal Arts and the College of Science, including forming, charging, and supporting transition teams for each college and representing the process to senior administration and the Purdue University Board of Trustees
- Partnering with the Northeast Indiana Regional Partnership and the Specialty Insurance Cluster of Indiana to lead the development of a multi-institution insurance credential to meet the talent pipeline needs of regional insurance businesses

Director of Strategic Planning and Implementation, Purdue University Fort Wayne, April 2019 – present
Chair, Strategic Planning Steering Committee, Purdue University Fort Wayne, October 2018 – April 2019

When Purdue Fort Wayne began a strategic planning process in October 2018, I was selected to chair the steering committee that provided direction and oversight to the process. As chair, and then as Director, with the assistance of external strategic planning consultants, I designed and managed all aspects of the process, from discovery and data collection through plan development, refinement, and approval by the Purdue University Board of Trustees in June 2020. As Director, I facilitate plan implementation and unit-level strategic planning activities and manage special projects that advance strategic university goals. Specific responsibilities include:

- Organizational oversight of the university's strategic planning and implementation processes, including communication, action planning, and budgeting
- Consulting on and liaising with all strategic and master planning efforts across campus
- Chairing the Strategic Plan Steering Committee, which is composed of representatives of all academic and administrative units on campus
- Leading the development and implementation of strategic initiatives that directly support the university's strategic goals

Representative achievements include:

- Leading an open, transparent, and highly-participatory strategic planning process (October 2018 – January 2020) that included acting as the primary collaborator with external strategic planning consultants; facilitating focus groups, open forums, and university-wide strategic planning sessions; recruiting and managing eight planning teams; facilitating meetings of the university leadership team; administering and analyzing multiple surveys; writing multiple reports to summarize planning work and collected feedback; and overseeing all university communications related to the strategic planning process
- Recruiting and managing six action planning teams (October 2019 – January 2020) that developed implementation plans for high-priority strategic activities that have resulted in:
 - The hiring of the university's first Chief Diversity Officer and the creation of the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion
 - A complete restructuring of academic advising operations across the university
 - A reevaluation and rebalancing of student scholarships to promote student recruitment and retention efforts
 - The selection and administration of a campus climate survey in Fall 2019 that yielded more than 2,200 student, staff, and faculty respondents
- Consulting on and/or executing strategic planning processes and events for the:
 - Division of Development and Alumni Relations (complete strategic plan)
 - Division of Student Affairs (complete strategic plan)
 - Division of Communications and Marketing (strategic planning retreat)
 - College of Visual and Performing Arts (strategic planning retreat)
 - Purdue Fort Wayne Foundation (complete strategic plan)
- Designing and managing all aspects of the university's COVID-19 scenario planning process (May 2020) for the 2020-21 academic year, including recruitment and organization of 22 task forces composed of 140

faculty and staff (approximately 13.5% of the university's full-time employees) and facilitation of an Executive Steering Committee composed of university senior leadership

- Co-chairing the Leadership Continuity and Development Design Team (September 2020 – January 2021), which was charged with developing a program to (1) implement processes for ensuring the continuity of leadership and operations at all levels of the university, (2) identify high-potential future campus leaders, and (3) provide structured leadership development opportunities and curriculum

Interim Chief of Staff to the Chancellor, Purdue University Fort Wayne, September – November 2020

Interim Deputy Chief of Staff to the Chancellor, Purdue University Fort Wayne, November 2020 – February 2021,

As interim Chief of Staff, I supported the Chancellor in all aspects of his job, including attending university and community meetings with him and on his behalf, scheduling meetings with internal and external stakeholders, developing or contributing to important messaging and presentations, and acting as an advisor on important university initiatives. When the Chief of Staff returned, I assumed the interim Deputy Chief of Staff role in order to complete several projects and provide ongoing support to the Chancellor.

Interim Assistant Vice Chancellor for Academic Programs, Purdue University Fort Wayne, January – June 2019

I worked with faculty, administrative units, Purdue University, and the Indiana Commission for Higher Education to assist with the development and approval of new academic programs and to explore new opportunities for partnerships and collaborations with other educational institutions. In addition to new program development, I supported the establishment of the university's first articulation agreements with community colleges in Michigan and Ohio to bring graduates of Associate of Applied Science program to Purdue Fort Wayne to enroll in our Bachelor of Applied Science program.

Presiding Officer of the Faculty, Indiana University-Purdue University Fort Wayne, August 2016 – August 2018

I was elected to two one-year terms as the presiding officer of the faculty. Representative responsibilities and activities included:
